



## Triumphs continue for swimmers

CRANBROOK Eastern Edge Swimming Club has given another great performance, stealing second place at the metropolitan championships with a fresh haul of records and medals.

Ahead of 55 other metropolitan clubs, Eastern Edge finished with 1320 points, behind the dominant Carlile Club at 1824, but above the Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre club, which finished with 1196 points.

"This is an exceptional effort for us with 32 swimmers when you compare it to Carlile who had 71 swimmers," said head coach Gai Campbell. "It was wonderful that a number of the younger swimmers made dramatic personal bests to finish with their medals."

Campbell gave special credit to Ella Basalo, 13, who won two golds (and

shaved seven and nine seconds off her personal bests), and Jasper Goodall, 11, who beat his previous best time by five seconds, winning a gold for backstroke.

Jordan White, 16, was another standout performer, breaking two metropolitan records.

"For young swimmers to swim that well at this level and do such significant personal bests is simply wonderful," Campbell said.

Together the squad managed 63 top 10 swims on the day, set eight metropolitan records, earning nine gold, 11 silver and seven bronze medals.
